First Day Info!

The first day of school for students in **Grades 1st-5th** begins at 8:25 on **Wednesday, August 30th.** A typical day for K-5 students, begins at 8:25 and ends at 2:55.

On **Wednesday**, **August 30th**, Kindergarten students will have a special "Meet Your Teacher" and visit the classroom morning while parents attend a school orientation.

Timing is as follows:

- 8:40-9:25: Last names that begin with A-L
- 9:30-10:15: Last names that begin with M-Z

While your child is meeting their teacher, you are invited to an informational presentation with Mr. Betts and the Tokeneke PTO in the common room.

For **K students**, the first official full day of school is **Thursday**, **August 31st**.

Setup an account on School Dismissal Manager 📝

The only way to designate a change in dismissal for your child, is through <u>School Dismissal Manager</u>. Dismissal changes may be made until 1:45 pm daily (early dismissal, pick up, playdate). School dismissal welcome parent letters will go out before school starts so look for it in your inbox. It will have information on how to sign up for an account.

2. Can I visit for lunch or recess? 2.

Visitors are not permitted to visit for lunch or on the playground during the school day unless they have the permission of the Principal or Assistant Principal. The playground is an extension of the classroom, just outdoors.

3. How can I speak with my child's teacher? 🧖

Teachers may be reached by email or direct voicemail. Please allow at least a day, since they may not have the opportunity to check while school is in session. In case of emergency, please contact the front office directly.

4. How can I celebrate my child's birthday? 🎂

Tokeneke will continue to have non-food celebrations for all birthdays. Students will not be allowed to bring food to share with their class or peers. Room parents, in conjunction with our Tokeneke PTO, will work with individual teachers and classes on other ways to celebrate children's birthdays.

5. Are nuts allowed in school?

At the elementary school level, some classrooms will be designated as "NUT FREE" due to student need. If your child's classroom is a "Nut Free" classroom, you will receive a notice from the school nurse or classroom teacher. Nuts will be permitted in the cafeteria this year, as there will be a designated NUT-FREE table.

6. Will my child get a locker? 🔒

Our students will use their individual lockers as assigned by teachers.

7. What are the "specials" at Tokeneke?

Art, Music, PE, World Language, and Library classes will be held in their typical special rooms and not in the students' classroom when possible. PE will also teach class outside when appropriate. Make sure your child is wearing the appropriate athletic footwear on PE days!

8. Where do I park? 🚗

You must park in the school parking lot if you intend to enter the school for any reason. Do not park in the bus loop or in the drop off/ pick up lane. Please drive slowly when you are on the school grounds.

9. May I bring my pet to pick-up? 🐕 🐢 🐓

Dogs and other pets are not permitted on school grounds between the hours of 7:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. In addition to health concerns, we have students who are afraid of even small, nice dogs and we want all students to be at school without worries.

10. Is a playdate allowed to come home with my child from school? 🚙

Yes, but it must be designated in School Dismissal Manager (SDM). If you are scheduling a playdate, the children must be picked up or walk home. Playdates are not allowed on buses. When setting up a playdate for your child, first make sure you have discussed the playdate with the other parent and have an agreement.

When setting up the Exception in SDM, select Pick Up by Playdates Parent as your dismissal instruction and provide the requested information: Name of Playdate and Playdate's parent. It is not necessary for the host parent to create an exception in this instance.

11. Is my child permitted to walk/ride their bike to school? 🚲

Students who walk to and from school must cross with the guard at the crosswalk at the intersection of Tokeneke and Old Farm Roads. The crossing guard is on duty from 8:15 a.m. – 8:40 a.m., and from 2:50 p.m. – 3:15 p.m. Please remain on the blacktop paths and do not allow children to cross the parking lots or bus loop. Please walk bicycles or scooters on school property at all times. Only students in Grades 3-5 are permitted to ride their bicycles or scooters to school, and are required to wear helmets. Students are to park and LOCK their bicycles in racks located on the school grounds.
